### 1836

The land where the building is located was purchased by a wine merchant named Jakab Kassowitz Hirsch, who would later be a member of the construction committee for the **Dohány Street Synagogue.** 

### 1844

Construction of the two-story building in classical style, designed by architect József Hild, began at the request of József Palmberger/Polimberger. The building started being referred to as **Palmberger House/Polimberger House.** 

## 1870

Under the architectural guidance of Károly Hild, a third floor was added to the existing two-story building, giving it its current appearance.

## 2005

The buildings were preserved due to their critical historical and cultural value.

### 1840

Jakab Kassowitz Hirsch registered the land in his name four years later, following the enactment o the law allowing Jews to .

### 1866

10. Síp Street was built, and a passage connecting the two streets began to form

### 1944

Ghetto Period: Following Germany's
occupation of Hungary, during World War II,
ghettos were established across the country. **10. Síp Street** became part of the ghetto area
set up in the region, but **10. Dohány Street**was not included in this ghetto. Consequently,
the passage was closed off with a brick wall.

# THE BUILDING'S ORIGINS

date back to 1844, crafted by the renowned architect József Hild in a timeless classical style. Originally a two-story structure, it underwent significant transformation in 1870 when Károly Hild, József's nephew, oversaw the addition of a new floor. This distinguished U-shaped building has been a witness to pivotal moments in history, from the 1848–49 Revolution to the 1956 uprising, and has been home to influential figures such as stained-glass artist Miksa Róth and pioneering photojournalist Stefan Lorant. During WWII, its walls bore witness to change as part of it was enclosed within the Jewish ghetto, while another section remained outside.

Throughout its vibrant history, the building has housed eminent personalities who left lasting imprints on Hungary's cultural and journalistic scenes. Miksa Róth, celebrated for his Art Nouveau stained glass that beautifies iconic landmarks like the **Hungarian Parliament,** set up his first independent workshop here.

Similarly, Stefan Lorant, born within these walls, went on to transform photojournalism with his groundbreaking Picture Post magazine, captivating millions across Britain.The building's story

continued with press baron Simon Tolnai, who acquired it in 1911 with plans to erect a modern office building–aspirations ultimately halted by the economic turmoil following World War I.

Today, Seven Pearl honors its storied past through an intricate restoration guided by national monument protection authorities. The building's design seamlessly blends its century-old charm with contemporary amenities. Visitors are invited to explore the 140-meter passage linking Dohány and Síp Streets, part of a larger network connecting key areas of the district.

As a tribute to its rich history, Seven Pearl continues to captivate with its architectural elegance and enduring ties to Budapest's vibrant past, inspiring admiration and awe in all who encounter it.
